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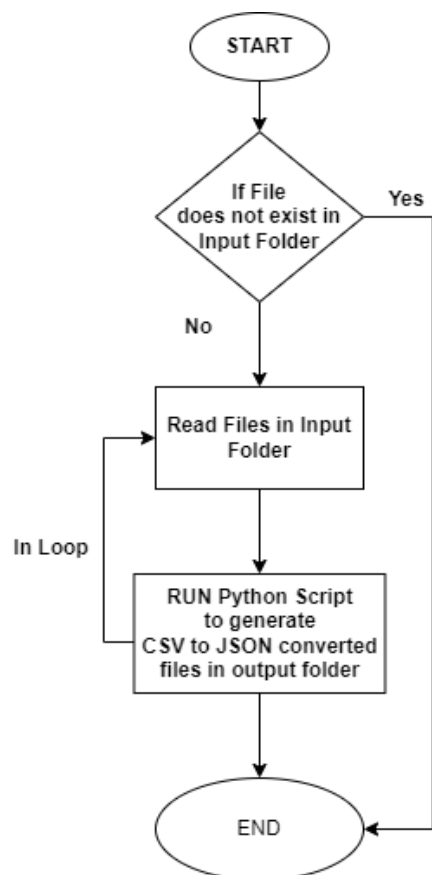
1. Introduction

2.1 System Requirements

3. User should download Python -3.10.7 and above

3.1 Quick Start

3.1.1 Configuration and Use

1. Download the Bot from the Bot-store.
2. Check the downloaded bot in your local machine private/Public section.
3. Once Bot is downloaded you are good to go for a run.
4. User given input folder path for CSV files, and those files are converted into JSON format
